# ESOL and Health and Social Care Certificate level 1

#### **Course Overview**

This course is for adults living, working or studying in Britain who do not have English as a first language and are interested in a career in the care vocational area. The course will help you develop your English language skills and also gain a Level 1 Introduction to Health, Social Care and Children's and Young Peoples Settings qualification. The course will help you learn English speaking, listening, reading, writing, maths and ICT, whilst learning how to care and work with children, vulnerable adults, and elderly people. This course is available at various venues across the city and at various times of the week.

#### What you will learn

The course offers the opportunity to learn English whilst studying for a vocational qualification. You will attend English classes to achieve national ESOL standards in Speaking, Listening, Reading and Writing. You will also learn Maths, ICT, Citizenship, Employability and Care knowledge to learn skills for being employed in the Care vocational area. You will learn about babies, children, teenagers, adults, and elderly people. How they develop, their needs, how to communicate with and support them, health and safety, safeguarding roles and responsibilities, and skills needed to be employed in the Care vocational area. You will be expected to complete assignments to demonstrate the knowledge you have learnt on the Health and Social Care topics to achieve the Care qualification. There is also an opportunity to undertake a Care placement.

#### **Entry Requirements**

Entry requirements for this course are English at entry level 3. A Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check will be completed at the beginning of the course, please see additional cost if extra charge is applied to you.

#### **Course Fees**

Leicester College offers free tuition and exam fees for full-time courses if you are a home student, aged between 16 and 18 on 31 August 2020 and meet the Skills Funding Agency (SFA) and Education Funding Agency (EFA) eligibility rules. A Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) check will be completed at the beginning of the course, the cost of £40 will be payable by students who are 19+ at the time of enrolment.<br/>

You will then need to confirm your acceptance of the course offered to you.
