Award in Emergency First Aid at Work Level 3

Course Overview

What you will learn

The qualification covers knowledge such as the roles and responsibilities of the first aider and how to assess an incident. You will learn first aid skills in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and use of an automated external defibrillator (AED), providing first aid to a casualty who is choking and dealing with external bleeding and hypovolaemic shock. During the course you will learn the following: - The role and responsibilities of a first aider. - Assessment of an emergency situation safely - Providing first aid to a casualty who is choking - Provide first aid to a casualty who is choking - Provide first aid to a casualty who is suffering from shock - Provide first aid to a casualty with external bleeding - Provide first aid to a casualty who is suffering from shock - Provide first aid to a casualty with minor injuries

Entry Requirements

To be eligible to apply for this course students must be: - Minimum of 19 years of age. - Physically capable of completing the practical assessment. - Minimum of Level 1 in English.

Course Progession

Employers are legally required to ensure their first aiders are competent. This one-day course will help your employer meet their regulatory requirements if the first aid risk assessment indicates that first aid training covering emergency protocols is sufficient for the workplace. First Aider need to keep training up to date with regular refresher courses.
