Course Overview

The qualification aims to provide you with a range of technical skills and knowledge, which will equip you to progress on to the level 3 Diploma in Hairdressing. You don't need any previous knowledge or experience to start this qualification and it will suit anyone who wants to learn all of the technical skills and knowledge needed to work as a junior stylist providing basic hairdressing services. In today's market, cutting, colouring, and styling are key skills and this is evidenced in the increase of salon businesses opening up. This course is designed for 19+ students only. An interview and literacy test will be carried out to assess your communication skills.

What you will learn

If you are interested in the level 2 Diploma in Hairdressing services, you will study theoretical aspects of the subject and apply them to practical tasks. Topics include the following:

1. The principles of hairdressing and barbering
2. Health and Safety
3. How to shampoo, condition and treat the hair and scalp
4. How to style, set and finish hair
4. Cutting hair using a variety of techniques
5. Colouring hair
6. Perming
7. Promoting products and services
8. Competition work

Entry Requirements

This is a part time adult evening course for learners 19+. Standard entry to the course will need a reference and evidence of attendance of 90% and above in college or the workplace
